General Comments

Monitoring visit performed.

Administrative records were reviewed - attendance, infant toddler records, fire drills, new staff information, napping schedule, incident reports, cleaning schedule, and outdoor maintenance checklist is being recorded and all in order. In regard to incident reports, please read above comment.

Children were in outdoor play this AM and they came indoors to eat lunch before nap. Educators were observed assisting when necessary. The educator in the older preschool group encourages children to be independent and to clean up after eating snacks and lunch or after play.

Some educators keep journals for tracking daily programming, others use a calendar. Documentation of children's learning is posted outside classrooms, but there is also evidence of children's interests inside the classroom.

The classrooms are neatly organized, clean, and inviting and toys, equipment and materials are assessable to children.

In regard to open fire pits, this is a great opportunity for children to experience this type of activity. I would recommend that you get signed parent consents to ensure everyone is aware and to store this information in the child's file for school age children that participate in this activity. The Operator has a safety plan in place, and I would add this to your parent handbook. It would be your responsibility to check with your insurance company as they provide the liability coverage.

Please keep the bin covered in the outdoor play area to keep toys and equipment protected from the weather.
