Comments: While on site the QA Monitor observed 4 baseball hats, a coat, 2 sweater and a tuque on top of the cubbies that were not labeled with the child's name. Since they were not stored in a storage space identifying the child's belongings, the staff members and the Quality Assurance Monitor were unable to identify which personal belonged to each child. The operator has shared that the children are placing their personal belongings on top of the cubbies and that the educators are often reminding children to place their belongings in their designated storage spaces. Personal belongings must be kept separate and be labelled with the child's name in order to reduce the spread of communicable disease. The operator shared that they will be adding additional bins labeled with children names to ensure that the personal belongings are kept separate and labelled. The educators and children have stored the personal belongings in their designated cubbies upon being notified. Deficiency is now compliant

When QA Monitor arrived on site the children were out to the school parc. When the children arrived at the facility the QA Monitor was able to observe lunch time, we're children we're encourage to socialize while eating. The QA Monitor was also able to observe positive child guidance and interactions.

During the inspection, the QA Monitor observed that the kitchen area next to the play areas was unlocked and a bottle of Bleach, a bottle of Vim and a bottle of Lysol were observed under the sink. The operator has confirmed that the space is not used by the daycare and belongs to the church. The QA Monitor reminded the operator that the Regulations require all chemical products, cleaning products and toxic products to be locked and inaccessible to the children. The children were not on-site during this observation and the kitchen door was locked before the children returned to the indoor play area. The operator has confirmed that they will consult with the church administration in order to find a solution to reduce the risks and to ensure this Regulation is compliant at all times.
