Comments: The inspector observed that a staff member has a first aid certificate. However, it is not a recognized provider, and the administrator is not able to provide proof that the first aid and CPR certificate of a new staff member is from a recognized WorkSafeNB provider. The operator must ensure that administrators and educators hold a valid first aid and CPR certificate. Later, the inspector received a copy via email of a valid first aid certificate. Deficiency is now compliant			
11.1(3) A staff member who works directly with infants or preschool children shall complete in each year 10 hours of training approved by the Minister related to the curriculum used at the designated facility.	11.1(3)	May 15, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed that the administrator is missing their proof of professional learning hours. The administrator confirmed that she did therefore complete her hours. The administrator sent via email copies of the professional learning hours, but those hours will only count for the next licensing year.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (b) child records that include: (v) the child's health history and a copy of the record of immunizations or a copy of an exemption.	24(1)(b)(v)	Apr 09, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed in 2 out of 10 children's file that the copy of the immunization is missing. The administrator must ensure that all children's files are completed before their first day at the facility.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (vii) a copy of a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate for each administrator and educator.	24(1)(c)(vii)	May 02, 2025	Apr 02, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed that a staff member has a first aid certificate. However, it is not a recognized provider, and the administrator is not able to provide proof that the first aid and CPR certificate of a new staff member is from a recognized WorkSafeNB provider. The operator must ensure that administrators and educators hold a valid first aid and CPR certificate. Later, the inspector received a copy via email of a valid first aid certificate. Deficiency is now compliant

Comments: The inspector observed a child sleeping on the floor with a blanket and a pillow. The inspector questioned the educator if the child usually sleeps, and the educator stated that it happens often that the child will fall asleep. In order to ensure that each child's needs are met, the operator must ensure that they have access to a cot. The inspector asked whether cots were available for the child, and immediately a cot was offered to the child. Deficiency is now compliant			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Apr 04, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed 2 containers of Lysol Wipes and a Lysol All-Purpose spray cleaner in a cabinet inside the bathroom of an infant classroom. In classrooms 3A and B, the inspector observed 2 bottles of Febreze Air Freshener, 1 can of shaving cream and 2 bottles of Scentsy Spray freshener not locked. While on site, the inspector discussed the location of the toxic products with educators and administrators.

Comments: The inspector observed a bottle of Motrin medication on the shelf inside a classroom. The inspector showed the medication to the educators and requested that all medication must be locked by a key. On site, the educators locked the medication. Deficiency is now compliant			
40(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that personal belongings of a child receiving services at the licensed facility that are brought to the licensed facility, including combs, brushes, toothbrushes, towels, washcloths, bedding, pacifiers and soothers, are (a) labelled with the name of the child.	40(1)(a)	Apr 09, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed that 3 water bottle out of 13 verified is not labelled. The administrator must ensure that all the personal belongings of the children are labelled.			
47(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall refuse admission to a child if satisfactory proof of the immunizations required by the Public Health Act or the regulations under that Act is not provided.	47(1)	Apr 09, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed in 2 out of 10 children's file that the copy of the immunization is missing. The administrator must ensure that all children's files are completed before their first day at the facility.			
48(4) If an infant is receiving services at a licensed facility, the operator shall (b) ensure that an infant who is bottle-fed is not fed in a crib.	48(4)(b)	Apr 02, 2025	Apr 02, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed an infant lying in their playpen while the educator was feeding them a bottle. The inspector stated that infants are not permitted to drink their bottles while lying down and should instead be held in the educator's arms. Upon the inspector's request, the educator immediately picked up the infant. Deficiency is now compliant			
48(5) If more than one bottle-fed infant is receiving services at a licensed facility, the operator shall ensure that each bottle is (a) labelled with the child's name, (b) used only for the intended child.	48(5)	Apr 09, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed an infant bottle with formula inside that is not labelled with the child's name. The administrator must ensure that all infant bottles are labelled.			
9(1) The child-to-staff ratio is one educator for each of the following groups of children of the same age receiving services at a full-time or part-time early learning and childcare centre: (a) three infants or fewer; (b) five children or fewer who are two years of age; (c) eight children or fewer who are three years of age; (d) ten children or fewer who are four years of age or older, but who are not yet attending school; and (e) 15 school-age children or fewer.	9(1)	Apr 02, 2025	Apr 02, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed 6 awake infants in the napping room with one educator, while the other educator was mopping the classroom floor. The inspector reminded both educators that child-to-staff ratio must be maintained at all times. The educator promptly went into the napping room to ensure the ratio. Deficiency is now compliant

The inspector observed the children playing freely inside and outside.
The inspector observed an infant group dancing. A preschool group is observed doing a craft with paint and an easter egg.

The inspector observed damage to a corner of the fence in the preschool outdoor park. The operator must ensure that the damaged is fixed.
