| Comments: During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed an infant bottle of milk without a cover in the child's lunch box, which was missing an ice pack. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator and administrator that all infant bottles must have a cover and be stored in a refrigerator. | | | |
