<p>Comments: During the monitoring inspection, the required number of educators was present for the number of children; however, a supervision concern was observed. The Quality Assurance Monitor noted that the hallway door leading to the outdoor play area was open, allowing an infant to crawl into the facility unnoticed by staff. The Quality Assurance Monitor alerted the educators, and the child was promptly returned outside.</p> <p>Additionally, one educator was observed sitting on the ground, leaning against the building, with a soda can and a telephone nearby. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educators of the importance of active supervision at all times.</p> <p>This incident was brought to the Administrator's attention, and it was addressed with the educators involved.</p> <p>Deficiency is now compliant.</p>			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor attended the facility to conduct a monitoring inspection.</p> <p>During the visit, the following were verified:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Child records, including signed consent forms •Medication records •Daily activities and routines •Child guidance practices •Indoor play area •Indoor play area materials and equipment •Rest areas •Health
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General Comments

•Medication

At the time of the visit, children were observed playing both outdoors and indoors, as well as preparing to eat lunch.

A discussion took place with the educators and the Administrator regarding access to art materials in the classrooms. It was observed that not all classrooms had art materials available on low, open shelves. Educators indicated concerns that children at this age may put crayons or markers in their mouths. The Quality Assurance Monitor recommended storing these materials in clear containers with lids that children cannot open independently but can access to express interest in drawing or coloring.

An additional discussion was held with the Administrator regarding active supervision and educator engagement during outdoor play. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that in one outdoor play area, educators were standing with their arms crossed while children were playing. No interactions or active engagement between educators and children were observed. The importance of active supervision and participation was emphasized. The Administrator addressed the situation immediately with the staff involved.
