General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on January 10, 2025.

children at all times.

During the inspection, children were observed throughout various daily activities, including transitions to snack time, indoor free play, the transition to outdoor play, and outdoor play itself. Proper handwashing procedures were observed during these transitions, ensuring hygiene standards are maintained. The center is equipped with steps or platforms to allow children to reach regular-sized toilets and sinks.

The educators shared that the children are currently very interested in mammoths, painting in the snow, conducting science experiments, and engaging in outdoor activities. The educators play an active role in facilitating and guiding these interests, particularly in outdoor play, where their involvement is hands-on and supportive of the children's learning and exploration.

The facility is well-maintained with several key practices in place. A daily incident log is kept, and parents are promptly informed of any incidents that occur, with incident report forms completed for reportable events. Parents are also granted access to the center at any time. The center ensures that children have at least one hour of outdoor play in each four-hour block when the majority of children are in attendance, weather permitting. Additionally, a daily routine is posted in each room, and evacuation procedures are prominently displayed. Life-threatening allergies are also posted to ensure safety. The environment is welcoming, with a room setup that encourages play and learning. Children's artwork is displayed throughout the facility, and books are carefully selected to reflect the children's interests.

The curriculum emphasizes various forms of literacy, and the indoor environment is rich with opportunities for creativity, exploration of the arts and sciences, problem-solving, and building supportive relationships. The center also provides children with access to their portfolios, which are actively being completed as part of their ongoing learning process.
