In another staff member's file, the diploma for her Early Childhood Education course is not recognized (after referring to appendix 25). Comments: On January 19, the Operator sent a email to the Quality Assurance Monitor asking for more time to meet this requirement. The operator wishes to make more observations among her new staff to see if an educator can take the administrator position. Another request for more time was sent to the Quality Assurance Monitor on February 9th. The operator informs the Quality Assurance Monitor that an ad was published for this position but have not yet found the right profile. At the time of the inspection, this requirement is still not met. The administrator and 50% of educators must hold a one-year Early Childhood Educaton Certificate or training that is equivalent in order to comply.

Comments:	The operator sent a written confirmation to the Quality Assurance Monitor via email, on January 19. The structure is installed according to the manufacturer's instructions. The operator also informs the Quality Assurance Monitor that the children will not use the play structure during the winter, as the protective surface is no longer adequate for use. The operator confirms that the staff is aware that the structure can't be used during the winter, because the structure and protective surfacing are not meeting the safety requirements, Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments:	Ints: During the follow-up inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed Lysol wipes in the office. At that time, the office was unlocked, and children had access. Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies must be locked and inaccessible to children. The admin/operator immediately brought the Lysol wipes into a locked storage in the kitchen. Deficiency is now compliant					

General Comments

Follow-up monitoring inspection conducted.

The ratio was respected at the time of the visit.

The Quality Assurance Monitor was able to observe children play indoors and transitioned to outdoor play.

The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the admin/operator regarding designation requirements. The QAM was informed that staff members are on track for professional learning hours, despite the newly hired staff. The operator continues to inform the staff when new sessions are available. The staff members are tracking their hours and inserting their certificates in their staff file when completed.

At the time of the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor did not have access to the office (when needed), where staff records were stored. As per section 22(5) of the ECS Act, immediately on demand by an inspector, the operator or the administrator of a licensed facility shall produce a record or a document required by the inspector under subsection (4). After about 20 minutes into the inspection, the operator arrives at the facility and unlocked the office so the Quality Assurance Monitor could have access to staff records. The Quality Assurance Monitor recommends the operator to leave a key to the staff, to avoid this from happening again. The deficiency is now compliant.
