Upon arrival, two school-aged children and one infant were observed exploring pumpkins in the indoor environment. The infant then transitioned to riding in the police car Power Wheels, pressing the button that activated the siren sounds. The infant was also observed playing the xylophone.

Documentation was visible throughout the room, including photographs, learning stories, individual portfolios, and individual and group artwork.

A clearly visible and prominent area was designated for posting the facility's license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documentation observed included incident logs, daily attendance records, daily information sheets, child profiles, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills.

A conversation took place with the Operator regarding the following:

- Ensuring that art activities are open-ended, encouraging children to explore and experiment with a variety of materials. This approach allows children to express themselves freely, fostering creativity, critical thinking, and personal expression, in alignment with the New Brunswick Curriculum Framework.
- Ensuring indoor and outdoor environments are organized into flexible learning centres that are well-defined and respond to the children's changing interests, abilities and desires, easily accessible, and provide ample space for children to engage in the intended activities. These centres should support individual and small group interactions, while accommodating and encouraging a variety of experiences that support appropriate curriculum implementation.
- Recommending the addition of a variety of musical instruments to support the children's interest in sounds.
