General Comments

Children were having a super-hero dress up day as part of March break activities. The two-year-old now has a coat rack to hang up their coats separately. Two sensory bins are set up in the two's room. One has rice, trucks, pieces of wood. There is also a truck book on display next to the sensory bin. The other sensory bin has soil, plastic flowers, wooden cookies and rocks. The infant's room is nicely set up, with plenty of age-appropriate materials. The educator is using webbing as a form of documentation and as a source of planning future activities. Please remember fire drills and playground checklists need to be completed on a monthly basis. The entrances need to be properly cleaned, removing excess materials from the hallway. It is also recommended the three-year-old group use their appropriate room, as the large room with 14 children seems be chaotic. By dividing the children in smaller groups the educators will be able to organize activities and there would be less issues with children sharing materials.
