Comments: School-Age Program: * Inspector observed that one incident log, dated April 17, 2026, not signed by the parent/guardian. This was reviewed and signed by the parent/guardian during the inspection. Deficiency is now compliant			

General Comments
<p>A renewal inspection occurred in the morning and part of the afternoon on the school-age portion of the license. At the time of the inspection, only the school-age program is operating. Administrator will notify EECD once the preschool program re-opens.</p> <p>Upon arrival at the childcare facility, Inspector observed the school-age children engaged in activities inside and preparing for outside play. Inspector observed that child-to-staff ratio was being respected, and the educators were observed taking a count of the number of children in their care before heading outside to play.</p> <p>While outside, Inspector observed the children blowing bubbles, exploring in the mud kitchen, socializing with their peers, creating designs with chalk, and playing with balls. Educators were observed by the Inspector positioning themselves throughout the outside fenced area, so that the children were always within sight.</p> <p>While children were in the indoor learning environment, Inspector observed the children having lunch, playing a Pokémon card game, building structures with magnet tiles and wooden blocks, socializing with their peers, engaged in the dramatic play/house area. Educators were observed, during lunch, sitting with the children engaged in their conversations with them.</p> <p>After lunch, Inspector observed the educators setting up art invitations for the children. Painting on a large piece of paper as well as a table with creative art materials: paper bags, markers and loose parts were made available for the children to explore and create. Educators were also observed engaging the children in a game of Bingo. Educators supplied an ice cream treat to the school-age children as part of their full day at the childcare facility.</p>

General Comments

Discussed Appendix 4—Extreme Allergy Management and Emergency Plan. If facility chooses to use this to ensure that page 5, "annual review" is signed each year by the parent/guardian if there are no changes to the information. If there are changes, then a new form will need to be completed by the parent/guardian and returned to the childcare facility.

Facility is currently not meeting the licensing requirement of 50% trained in Early Childhood Education as the preschool is not currently operating only the school-age program. This requirement is not mandatory for school-age programs. The on-site Administrator has their Early Childhood Education Diploma and curriculum training. Administrator indicated that when the preschool re-opens the preschool room will have two staff members. One educator will have their Early Childhood Education. Thus, meeting the requirement of 50% trained in Early Childhood Education.

Educators were observed using positive child guidance techniques during their interactions with the children.

Facility is recommended for license renewal, pending the recommendation from Fire.
