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General Comments
A renewal inspection occurred on the license. Upon arrival at the childcare facility, Inspector observed that the children in the two-three-year-old room as well as children from 4-year-old room were preparing for outside play in the fenced play area. Inspectors observed that in the indoor environments, defined interest centers were set up and available for the children to interact and engage with. In the 4-year-old room, Inspector observed that samples of the children's art displayed on the walls as well as documentation and stories of activities that the children have been engaged in. Pictures of the children participating in an outing and picnic at the neighborhood park, outdoor bowling, creating bugs with loose parts, making "mud soup" outside, and exploring a farm with toy animals, barns, and tractors. During the inspection, the children were observed engaged in Dinosaur play with loose natural material, leaves, dirt, and sticks. The children had morning snacks outside and were observed playing in the sandbox, water play and in the playhouse. In the school-age room, the children were observed making a glitter, science experiment with their educators. Pictures and learning stories on the wall depict the children engaged in building structures from cardboard, painting rocks, science experiments, learning movie making and programming. In the indoor learning environment, Inspector observed age-appropriate materials for the children to interact and engage with as well as Lego, mini pool table, soccer, and indoor basketball game. In the 2–3-year-old room, Inspector observed that the children have been participating in a bug hunt, exploring bouncing putty, reading books and making playdough with their peers. Discussions occurred with the Administrator regarding mixing the school-age children with the children in the 4-year-old group when numbers are low. This can occur occasionally. Ratio must always be maintained and children always supervised. Discussed that when mixing 4-year-olds with school-age children that the ratio for

4-year-olds is to be observed until the day that the child(ren) start Kindergarten, then the ratio would change to the school-age ratio.

Licensing reviewed, all staff files and these were verified complete with all required checks and documentation. As well all children's files were reviewed and verified to have all required information.

Educators were observed, during the inspection, using positive child guidance techniques. Tending to the needs of the children in their care and speaking kindly and appropriately to them.

Facility is recommended for license renewal, pending the recommendation from Fire.
