General Comments

Upon arrival of licensing staff for the annual renewal inspection, children were observed actively engaged in a variety of outdoor activities. They played in the gaga ball pit, played ball hockey, and participated in both soccer and basketball games. Children joined in a round of "Ring Around the Rosie," used hula hoops, and gathered around outdoor tables to draw and create.

Educators brought out a large piece of paintable fabric, offering an open-ended art experience with paint, which several children took part in. Another craft activity included making binoculars with paper. Group games such as "Among Us" and "Apples to Apples" were observed, as well as creating a play kitchen with available materials.

Snack was made available outdoors and offered on a flexible schedule, allowing children to eat when they felt ready. Throughout these activities, educators were present and engaged, joining in play and supporting children's needs as they arose. One child slipped while playing ball hockey; an educator responded right away, checking on the child and ensuring their well-being.

Following outdoor play, the group transitioned indoors for lunch. After washing their hands, the children gathered in a circle, where the educator sparked a discussion by asking about their plans for the Canada Day weekend. The children shared their upcoming family activities, creating an engaging atmosphere. Afterwards, they made their way to the tables and ate their lunches together. The tables were cleaned once everyone finished eating.

After lunch, the group moved into quiet time, allowing for rest and low-energy activities. Children chose from options such as reading, drawing, building with LEGO, relaxing with stuffed animals, board games, or playing with dolls. Part of the group gathered outside with an educator to play on the play structure, play soccer, find flowers in the bushes, and simply run around.

The indoor environment was well organized. Materials available included books, wooden blocks, LEGO, puzzles, dolls, a craft area, and a dramatic play space. The setup allowed children to explore, create, and engage in both independent and collaborative play.
