- · focus on individuals or small groups of children; and
- emphasize a strength based approach.

Currently, this facility has changed from a non-designated to designated facility. The Operator stated that they would appreciate support from the curriculum team. A referral will be made.

The environments have a variety of materials and learning centres available to the children. The learning centres included but are not limited to the following: books., blocks and constuction, cars and trucks, dramatic play, barn and animal play, loose part, felt stories. Learning stories, and the children's art work were evident in the classrooms.
