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Educators in each room were observed engaging with the children. They were at the children's level, playing, reading and having conversations with them. The child guidance was gentle and the educators helped the children to reflect on their actions. One educator intervened with a child who had put a demand on another child and the educator very gently asked the child how they could say that nicer. Educators comforted children when they were upset and redirected more challenging behaviors.

Pre-planned programming and documentation is evident. Educators are journaling, using pictures to document experiences, creating learning stories, and displaying the children's artwork. There appears to be a good balance of activities and experiences offered to the children. A routine to reflect the children's needs is evident in each room.

The filing system is organized and all information required to meet the regulations was evident. Attendance records, potential illness forms, infant / toddler sheets, and medication charts, are being used and filled out properly. Monthly fire drills are being conducted and all ages on both levels are participating.

Licensing staff can now recommend facility for licensing pending fire approval.
