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| General Comments |
| <p>A Monitoring Inspection occurred July 2025</p> <p>The children were observed engaging in a variety of activities across indoor and outdoor environments, as well as during transitions between both environments. Observations also included snack and nap times.</p> <p>Tykes: The children were observed climbing on the climbing dome, using hula hoops, digging, drawing on tires with chalk, using the water pump, throwing a frisbee, and looking for bugs/slugs outdoors. Indoors, the children were observed washing hands before lunch. The educator read a story to the children before eating. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in camping, building with blocks, and planting.</p> <p>Tots/Sprouts: The children were observed playing on the playground, jumping in puddles, swinging in the hammocks, and playing with the balls. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in trucks, balls, digging, dramatic play, and movement.</p> <p>Munchkins: The children were observed outdoors in the fenced-in play yard, engaged in water play, drawing with chalk, and listening to a story that their educator was reading outdoors. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in water and open-ended art.</p> <p>All rooms were set up with materials that invite the children to play. Several forms of documentation were visible in the indoor environment. These included individual child portfolios, learning stories/webs, photographs, and children's artwork, all of which reflect ongoing learning.</p> |

General Comments

A clearly visible and prominent area was designated for posting the facility's license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documentation observed included incident logs, daily attendance records, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills.

The diaper changing area is located within one meter of a sink, supporting proper hygiene practices. Diaper changing procedures were posted and clearly visible. Diaper changing procedures were observed and followed appropriately.

A conversation took place with the administrator on the following:

- Educators to ensure daily attendance records reflect the current number of children in their group.
- Ensuring that no standing water is present in the tires located in the play area.
