31(3) An operator shall maintain the outdoor play area of a licensed facility to ensure the safety of the children.	31(3)	Mar 06, 2026	
<p>Comments: The inspector observes that the pathway used by children to access the outdoor play area is covered in ice and has not been salted. The operator is required to ensure that all outdoor areas used by children, including access pathways, are maintained in a safe condition and remain free of hazards to protect the safety and well being of the children.</p>			
32(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide indoor play area materials and equipment that are (d) clean and in good repair.	32(1)(d)	Mar 12, 2026	Mar 05, 2026
<p>Comments: During the inspection, the inspector opened a door in the indoor play area and observed that it was not properly secured. The door detached and fell toward the inspector, with only one remaining screw partially attached at the bottom. At the time of the incident, children and educators were outdoors. The inspector informed the educator that the door must be removed immediately, as it poses a safety hazard to children. The administrator stated that she was aware of the issue and that maintenance was scheduled to repair it later that evening. Administrator removed the door completely with the last screw remaining. Deficiency is now compliant</p>

<p>Comments: The inspector verifies the cabinets in all three bathrooms and observes that in two of the washrooms, Lysol bottles are not locked. In the third bathroom, a container of Lysol wipes is found placed on top of the paper towel dispenser. The administrator immediately removes the products. Operator must ensure that toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies are locked and inaccessible to children at all times. Deficiency is now compliant</p>			
40(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that personal belongings of a child receiving services at the licensed facility that are brought to the licensed facility, including combs, brushes, toothbrushes, towels, washcloths, bedding, pacifiers and soothers, are (a) labelled with the name of the child.	40(1)(a)	Mar 12, 2026	
<p>Comments: The inspector verifies 12 lunchboxes and identifies that 7 are not labeled with the respective child's name. The inspector also verifies 10 water bottles and observes that 6 are unlabeled. The operator is required to ensure that all personal belongings brought into the center are clearly labeled with the child's name. The administrator indicates that she will address this matter with parents during pick up on the day of the renewal inspection to ensure compliance.</p>

Comments: The inspector verifies 12 lunchboxes and identifies that 7 are not labeled with the respective child's name. The inspector also verifies 10 water bottles and observes that 6 are unlabeled. The operator is required to ensure that all personal belongings brought into the center are clearly labeled with the child's name. The administrator indicates that she will address this matter with parents during pick up on the day of the renewal inspection to ensure compliance.			

General Comments

The inspector is onsite to complete the renewal inspection on a day when children are present for the full day due to March Break.

Observations include children engaging in a tag-style noodle game, participating in a structured pool activity, and others engaging in free play. In the late afternoon, children accessed the outdoor play area.

Discussions were held with the administrator regarding a damaged section of the fence surrounding the outdoor play space. The administrator indicated that children would not be permitted outdoors due to this concern; however, inspectors advised that outdoor play may continue, as children's safety is not compromised when active supervision is maintained. Prior to providing this recommendation, the inspector assessed the outdoor play area and the condition of the fence.

The ratio is respected during the renewal period.
