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General Comments
Upon arrival , the children were in the outdoor classrooms. The outdoor classrooms are an extension of the indoor classrooms with a variety of materials, learning centres, and invitations to play set up to foster the children's growth and development. It included but was not limited to construction areas, music walls, water play in a variety of forms, dramatic play areas including a kitchen and a restaurant, sand, art, tables, make belief gardens, and hammocks, The extent to which a child's imagination could be expressed in this environment is endless. New shade has been added to the environment which helps cover and keep the children safe while they are at play. On one of the tables outside, an educator had set out stamps, paper and paint which some of the children appeared to be enjoying. In another section a few children advised licensing staff that they were making pepper cupcakes with grass and water and in the woods where the children were hard at work preparing orders in the restaurant, doing gymnastics or swinging. The educators are involved and engaged with the children at all times. They play when invited and were observed taking interest in what the children were doing and having conversations with them. Redirection was used as needed. One of the children was going to be hands on with another child and because the educator recognized it, she asked the child to hold a water bottle for her. It stopped the behaviour before it occurred. Documentation was observed both in the outside and the inside environments. There were learning stories posted on the fence outside and posted for each age group when you walked into the preschool building. They were also observed in many other areas on the walls. Family pictures, community pictures, and answers to questions that were asked to the children were also documented. Some of the artwork was presented in frames which shows respect for the children's work and valuing their accomplishments. As it was a hot day, you could often observe the educators bringing the children in for cool down and bathroom breaks. Most of the children ate meals inside but some did choose to return outside to eat if they weren't going to sleep. Quiet music and dimmed lights help calm the environment for lunch and rest time followed for the preschool children.

General Comments

When the children started to wake, they were permitted to leave their mats and enjoy quieter play. Some educators were observed giving snuggles and hugs to those children who were having a harder time waking up. The care for these children was observed as gentle and loving for the duration of licensing staff's visit.

All documentation for licensing was organized, complete and easily verified.

I can recommend for licensing pending a current Health and Fire inspection.
