General Comments

Licensing Staff arrived at 123 Learn with Me Childcare to perform a Monitoring Inspection. Upon arrival, one small group of children were playing a fishing game while another small group of children were by the art area with the Operator. The Operator is in the process of making changes to the layout in the indoor environment. The children were eager to show Licesning Staff a new farm and dinosaur home they built with the Operator. The farm had several farm animals, a small felt pond with fish, a garden area, wooden discs and peg people. The dinosaur home had dinosaurs, small sticks, a bonfire made of red tissue paper and a nest with two little dinosaur eggs.

This morning the children were showing an interest in creating art. A group of children set up paper, scissors and bingo dabbers. The Operator expanded on their interest by adding large chart paper, stamps, pain sticks and other crafting materials. The children painted pictures of their family and practiced fine motor skills, practicing holding and cutting with scissors. Materials were in good condition and easily accessible to the children. Later in the morning, the Operator was heard offering gentle reminders before cleaning up to prepare for outside. Age-appropriate independence was encouraged while the children were getting their jackets and boots on. While outside the children were observed playing in the mud kitchen, scooping, measuring and pouring water from one pan to another. There was evidence of daily routine and a caring environment as the children were seen smiling and laughing as they blew bubbles, played on an airplane and went on the swing set. Since the sun was out today, the children stayed out a bit longer before transitioning back inside for lunch.

All transition periods today were smooth. The children appeared comfortable and familiar with the daily routine and the Operator. Only positive child guidance was observed during today's Monitoring Inspection. The Operator is patient, nurturing and attentive to the needs of the children. The Operator encourages independence, offering assistance if needed. It is evident the interest of the children are noted, and the indoor environment is set up based on their interest.
