## General Comments

Upon arrival, the children were getting ready to have snack. Food is brought from home and the children sit together at the table in booster seats or high chairs for the infants. The Operator engages with the children by talking to them and meeting their needs as needed. The Operator and her husband are kind and caring towards the children. After snack, the children prepared for a walk. Hands and faces were washed and the operator did diaper changing.

The play room is located in the lower level and the space is organized with many learning materials for the children. It includes but is not limited to blocks, puzzles, animals, cars and trucks, musical instruments, dramatic play, Art and Joey Play couches. The materials are labelled and the environment has pictures of the community that the children are surrounded by. There were also learning stories posted.

After the children returned from their walk, they engaged in play in the outdoor play space. There is a variety of materials available for the children. The children seemed to be very interested in the water pump table. The outdoor play space includes a music wall, ball drop, kitchen, ride on toys, lawn mowers, a boat, sand table, blocks, an abundance of trucks and little table and chairs. Umbrellas are used for shade and the materials meet the needs of the different ages that the operator has in their care.

The children returned into the house for lunch, and had a quiet time with books. Diapers were changed and the children prepared for rest time. The routine is well-planned but flexible to meet the children's needs.

All documentation was easily verified for licensing purposes. Attendance records, infant toddler sheets, fire drills, potential illness forms, incident records were being used and filled out as needed. Please continue to develop a pre-planned program and keep them on file for the year.

I can now recommend facility for licensing.
