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General Comments
Licensing staff arrived at the licensed early learning and childcare home to conduct the annual license renewal inspection. Upon arrival, the children were washing their hands in preparation for their morning snack. During snack time, licensing staff observed an authentic and engaging conversation between the operator and the children. The discussion centered on the children's cats, and the children also enthusiastically shared details about their upcoming walk. One child spoke about feeding horses during their daily outdoor excursions. After snack, the children independently washed their hands. The operator then applied sunscreen to each child and ensured they were wearing hats before leaving for their morning walk. During the walk, several planned and spontaneous learning opportunities were observed: The children stopped to pick flowers from neighbouring lawns. They visited a nearby brook to investigate whether it contained water following the previous day's rainfall. The children then stopped to visit and feed the horses. Although the horses did not approach the fence as they usually do, the children threw the grass they had collected into the fenced corral for the horses. The final stop was the neighbourhood library, where the children selected a book to read for the day. The children had forgotten to bring a book to exchange; however, the operator indicated that a book would be brought during their next visit. Upon returning to the home, the children washed their hands and waited patiently for lunch to be served. Following lunch, the children remained seated at the table and participated in a mark-making and colouring activity while the operator completed diapering routines. Once the children requiring diaper changes had been attended to, the group moved downstairs for gross motor play. During gross motor play, the children demonstrated confidence and physical skills while climbing on a cushion climbing structure. The children climbed to the top of the structure and jumped safely into a cushion pit or onto a mat. The operator remained attentive and provided appropriate supervision throughout the activity. Throughout the inspection, the children were observed to be engaged, curious, and actively involved in

meaningful conversations and experiences within their community. The operator supported the children's interests, encouraged exploration of the natural environment, promoted literacy through regular visits to the neighbourhood library, and provided opportunities for both fine motor and gross motor development.

Based on the observations made during the annual license renewal inspection, licensing staff recommend the early learning and childcare home for renewal of its license. The operator was observed providing a nurturing, responsive, and developmentally appropriate environment that supported the children's learning, well-being, and overall development.
