Comments: During the follow-up inspection, the administrator informed the Quality Assurance Monitor that the board member in question, who had not completed a Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening, is no longer part of the board of directors. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: During the follow-up inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that in one classroom, the reason for a child's absence was not recorded, and in another classroom, the departure time for one child was missing. This was brought to the attention of the staff members in the respective classrooms, and the educators promptly corrected their daily attendance records. Deficiency is now compliant.									

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor was on site to conduct a follow-up inspection. Child-to-staff ratios were maintained throughout the visit.

During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed children having their snack and preparing to go outside to play.

During the follow-up inspection, a discussion took place between the administrator and the Quality Assurance Monitor regarding the transition of infants to the two-year-old room. While gathering ratios, the Quality Assurance Monitor noted that two children who had recently turned two years old were still in the infant room. The administrator explained that the children had turned two on Monday and confirmed that there was available space in the preschool group. However, due to a staff member being on vacation, the transition was planned for the following Monday.

CHUPIA	Comment

The Quality Assurance Monitor clarified that while it is understandable for children to remain in the infant room temporarily when no preschool spaces are available, the absence of a staff member is not a valid reason to delay the transition. The administrator acknowledged this and stated they believed transitions could occur at any time as long as they were done promptly. The Quality Assurance Monitor explained that while preschool-to-preschool transitions can be flexible, infants must be transitioned to the preschool group immediately upon turning two years old if space is available.
