Comments: In the infant classroom, art materials were stored where infant could not reach. Indoor play area material and equipment must be accessible on low open shelves. The educator immediately lowered the art materials so children can have easy access. Deficiency is now compliant

Comments: In one classroom, the Quality Assurance Monitor found a bottle of dawn powerwash dish spray. This is a product that must be kept out of reach of children. Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies must be locked and inaccessible to children. The educator immediately locked the product. Deficiency is now compliant			
48(4) If an infant is receiving services at a licensed facility, the operator shall (d) ensure that each bottle is stored with a cover in the refrigerator.	48(4)(d)	Oct 03, 2024	Oct 03, 2024
Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed infant bottles stored in a bag with ice packs. Infant bottles must be stored with a cover in the refrigerator. The administrator immediately placed the bottles in the refrigerator. Deficiency is now compliant
