General Comments

This was the operator's first monitoring inspection since becoming licensed.

Children were observed during snack time, indoor play, and at the neighborhood park.

The operator ensured that children washed their hands at required times and she also disinfected the snack table before and after use.

Child guidance was positive throughout the monitoring inspection. She used kind words to give gentle reminders and spoke to children on their level.

The children were playing with magnet tiles and the operator used this opportunity to include both numeracy and literacy into the experience. She counted with the children and discussed different colors.

Children were familiar with the routine and expectations. The operator made the process of cleaning up toys a fun one by asking the children to pick up certain color magnet tiles and to find certain buckets for the toys. Time warnings were given to transition between activities.

The operator helped children get ready for outdoors in their winter clothing. The process was calm and as children were dressed, they sat on the step in the foyer.

While walking to the park, younger children held onto the wagon or to the operator's hand while on the street. The children were familiar with the walk and remained close to the operator and knew when to stop.

The operator had a wagon with all required items for an outing- emergency contacts and a full first aid kit. She also took outdoor play materials in the wagon- snow molds to make snow bricks and scoops to make snowballs.

She remained engaged with the children at the park, sitting in the snow making snowballs and she was also appropriately dressed for winter play.
