General Comments
<p>Monitoring Inspection:</p> <p>Children and educators observed engaged in a variety of activities this morning including gross motor play, mark making, stories, building with magnetic tiles, Lego, exploring loose parts and outdoor play.</p> <p>The infants in Infant Room 1 were observed reading stories and mark making with chalk on the new chalkboard installed on the wall. The infants in Infant Room 2 were observed exploring a spinning gross motor toy and exploring their learning environment freely. Educators in both rooms were observed at the children's level engaging in play and meaningful conversations.</p> <p>Improvements have been noted in the Twos Room. It was observed that the room has been rearranged, divided into interest centres and reorganized this has improved the flow of the room. Labels have been added to bins and include five different languages; each language included is spoken within one of the children's homes. Children and educators were engaged in a land, air and sea matching game and building with magnetic tiles.</p> <p>The children and educator in the Fours Room were observed exploring invitations set-up throughout the learning environment. A group of children were exploring the Tuff Tray and light table that is set-up with arctic animals, ice blocks, and other loose parts. The educator in this room played a clean-up song to help children to transition from play to lunch time.</p> <p>Purposeful planning is evident through documentation, invitations and materials added to the environments that support the children's current interests (stacking, dumping, climbing, books, vehicles, doctor, snow and arctic animals).</p> <p>Nap time was observed today. The environments are dim, and educators put soft music on to ensure the environment is relaxing for children. The children's cots are set-up with bedding and are situated at an adequate distance apart. Educators observed comforting children as they settle in for nap.</p>

General Comments

Homemade chicken noodle soup with crackers, egg salad sandwiches and milk were served for lunch. Handwashing routines were observed during washroom routines and before mealtimes. Daily attendance records are accurate and reflect all children present. Child-to-staff ratio was observed to be met during Monitoring Inspection. Daily Information Sheets for Infants were observed to be completed throughout the day. New staff file (6) review was completed, all required documents are in place.
