General Comments

Many materials have been added to the infant spaces. The learning centres include but are not limited to books, a kitchen, big blocks, dolls, balls, trucks and cars. The rooms have a cozier area with softer seating and materials but also have space for gross motor activities.

Pre-planned programming and evidence of the children's learning is consistent throughout each classroom. The educators have posted many pictures of the children and have created learning stories to capture what the children are engaged in. The children's artwork is also displayed throughout the classrooms.

The educators are very kind and loving towards the children. They were observed at the infants' level, playing and softly speaking to them. They would model appropriate behaviours and language for this age group by creating sentences or using words that the children would understand. For example, licensing staff observed one of the older infants taking a toy from another child. The educator intervened and said, "No thank-you, please give it back". Educators were often seen in one on one play with the infants or giving care as needed.

The educators met the school age children at the school then allowed them to play in the outdoor play area. The educators positioned themselves throughout the outdoor play area to ensure adequate supervision. Some of the educators were pushing swings and another was playing volleyball with the children. The younger children went into the facility to use the washroom and wash their hands. As it was a nice day, the children are having snack outside. Today's snack was pumpkin chocolate chip cookies and milk.

The school-age indoor play area has an abundance of materials for the children to play with. It includes but is not limited to, a kitchen, big blocks, art materials, a doll house, trucks and cars, barbies, a doll house, car ramps, games, lego, and a cozy corner with soft materials and books.

The filing system was complete and organized. All documents that are required for licensing purposes were easily verified. Licensing staff can now recommend facility for licensing.
