<p>General Comments</p> <p>Room 1 The QAM observed documentation on the walls related to children's exploration of nature and a web about the park. Invitations available included a forest landscape, cutting materials, rocks, and printing activities. Children were observed washing their hands and transitioning to snack. The transition outdoors occurred without noted issues.</p> <p>In the outdoor learning environment, children engaged with materials such as a jungle gym, playhouse, tires, a dramatic play kitchen, and hammocks. Educators were observed interacting with children throughout the period.</p> <p>Room 2 Children were observed participating in a gross motor activity involving dancing and music with one educator. Another educator supported children with handwashing before snack. After snack, one educator read a story to a small group while other children engaged with invitation tables. Documentation on the walls included drawings related to nature and outdoor experiences.</p> <p>Room 3 Invitations included popsicle sticks and magnet blocks. The educator reported that children are currently showing interest in dramatic play and outdoor activities. Children were observed in the outdoor learning environment using playhouses, hammocks, a slide, trucks, and books.</p> <p>QAM made a recommendation to apply salt or sand directly within the outdoor learning environment on icy days to reduce the risk of slips or falls. Another recommendation was to use an alternative outdoor area on days when the primary outdoor is quite icy.</p>
