<p>General Comments</p> <p>Licensing staff attended the licensed facility to conduct the annual license renewal inspection.</p> <p>At the time of arrival, all child-to-staff ratios were within regulatory requirements as outlined in the Early Childhood Services Act. Children were in the process of eating their morning snack. Educators demonstrated appropriate supervision throughout the snack period while also attending to diapering routines, ensuring children were safely supervised at all times.</p> <p>During the inspection, licensing staff observed that the infant outdoor play environment had sufficient shade to protect infants from sun exposure.</p> <p>In the indoor play environments, licensing staff noted an abundance of pedagogical documentation displayed on the walls in each classroom. This documentation supported children in revisiting and reflecting on their learning experiences. In one of the infant classrooms, photographs of each child's family were displayed at a low height beneath a window, allowing infants to view and interact with the images as needed.</p> <p>Each classroom was equipped with a variety of age-appropriate play materials, including books; Little People figurines; transportation toys such as airplanes and buses; and farm-themed resources. Additional materials included dolls with accessories, wooden blocks, age-appropriate tools and toolboxes, wooden play kitchens, and related accessories.</p> <p>In the outdoor play environment, licensing staff observed a wide range of play resources that supported exploration and imaginative play. These materials included shovels, rakes, buckets, trucks, cars, mud kitchens with accessories, bubbles, strainers for sifting, and dolls with accessories.</p> <p>Throughout the inspection, educators were consistently observed engaging positively with the children.</p> <p>Based on the observations made during the inspection, licensing staff recommend the facility for renewal of its license.</p>
