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General Comments
Licensing staff arrived at the facility at 9:30am. Upon arriving the children were observed engaging in free play activities in the playground. The preschool aged children were observed playing in the sandbox, mud kitchen and on the various wooden structures. An educator was observed blowing bubbles with a group of children while another educator was observed sitting in the sandbox while playing with the children. Various and sufficient outdoor play materials was observed in the playground. The playground was clean and presented no safety hazards. Daily attendance records, the children's lunch boxes and water bottles were observed outside. During this time, the infants were observed playing with a water table, toy trucks and in the dramatic playhouse. The children had access to a white bucket filled with outdoor play materials. The educators were observed engaging in play with the children while supervising. Later, an educator in the preschool aged groups was observed setting out a playdough invitation in the gravel near a wooden playhouse. The educator set out trays, accessories and various playdough colors on the ground for the children. A large group of children and a few educators were observed sitting in the gravel while playing with playdough. Another group of children were observed playing with buckets, spoons and a few musical instruments. An educator was heard praising the children while they made music with the material. As the children played outside, an educator was observed taking pictures of the children for documentation and asking them what they were doing. Licensing staff observed an educator asking some children if they had to use the washroom while they were outside. Washroom breaks were observed while the children played outside. Once it was time to transition inside, a verbal prompt was given to the children to start cleaning up and gather their lunch boxes and water bottles to go inside. The children were observed transitioning inside with the educators. The educators were observed completing a head count once inside. The children's personal belongings were properly stored in their cubby areas. Proper diaper changing was followed and the children's hands were washed. Some educators were observed reading books while other groups sung and danced during diaper changing. Once diaper changing was complete, the children sat down at the lunch tables and ate. The educators were observed supervising the children while eating and helping them open their snacks. The children's water bottles were filled during lunch time. The children's beds were prepared during lunch time. Once the children finished eating, they used the washroom, washed their hands and proceeded to lay down for nap.

General Comments

The indoor environment had a variety of play materials located on low accessible shelving. Recent child artifacts and documentation of the children's learning was observed in each group. The daily schedules were posted in each group. A conversation was had with the site manager to provide a proper seating area for the children under the large, shaded area. A seating area such as picnic tables would allow the children to have a hard and even surface for activities such as playing with playdough and coloring. This would allow the children to have snacks and/or meals outside in the shade rather than sitting on the bench against the infant fence.
