### General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on May 30, 2025.

Children were observed during free play outdoors. Educators noted that the children are currently very interested in being active outside, as well as in activities such as face paint Fridays, bubbles, sports, art projects indoors, and opportunities to build with LEGO, beading, and crochet. Educators were observed using positive language and giving gentle reminders. Outdoors, educators played an active role in the children's activities.

A daily incident log is maintained. Parents are advised of incidents, and incident report forms are completed in the event of reportable incidents. Parents of children present at the center are granted entry at any time. The daily routine is posted, and evacuation procedures are displayed in a prominent location. Children are greeted with enthusiasm upon arrival. Well-defined learning and play areas were observed, and several pieces of children's artwork were displayed throughout the facility.

Traffic areas and outdoor walkways are clean and free of clutter. Toxic products such as chemical products and cleaners are locked and inaccessible to the children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. Allergy information on any child is posted. Outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.

A conversation was held with the educators regarding the strengths and needs of the facility. Identified strengths include daily activities that are purposefully planned and documented in the program, as well as opportunities for both individual and group experiences. However, some needs were also discussed. These included ensuring that supervision to the bathroom is not required for school-age children (following the guideline-when supervision is adjusted, staff members know at all times where the children are and check on them), ensuring that fire drills are recorded monthly on the record form, and ensuring that children's hands are washed before eating snacks.
