### General Comments

A renewal inspection occurred today. The educators and children were engaged in various activities around the indoor environment. Seasonal materials, such as felt Christmas trees were available for decorating, and natural materials like pinecones were incorporated into the play kitchen area, adding both sensory and imaginative play opportunities. These materials reflected the children's current interests in holiday themes.

Arts and crafts activities were varied and engaging. Children participated in pipe cleaner bracelet making, which supported fine motor development, and open-ended art projects that encouraged creativity and self-expression. Holiday crafts were integrated into daily programming, allowing children to explore seasonal materials. A selection of board games, including Yahtzee, Battleship, and Pickle Penguins Last Words were on open shelving for the children to access. These games promoted turn-taking, problem-solving, and social interaction among peers. Costumes were available to support imaginative role play, further diversifying the range of activities offered.

Laundry detergent was observed in the shelf above the washing machine. Toxic products, including laundry detergent must be locked at all times. Inspector recommended a lock similar to the one that locks the staff and children's files to be used.

All the staff files were observed and complete. A random review of children's files was reviewed and also complete. Fire drills and all incident reports were recorded accurately.
